Stephen Flynn is a researcher, independent advisor, and frequent commentator on homeland security, global trade and transportation security, and emergency preparedness. He is the author of the critically acclaimed and national bestseller, *America the Vulnerable*. He is currently writing a new book to be published by Random House in early 2007 entitled, *The Edge of Disaster: Catastrophic Storms, Terror, and American Recklessness*. He is the inaugural occupant of the Jeane J. Kirkpatrick Chair in National Security Studies at the Council on Foreign Relations. Dr. Flynn served as Director and principal author for the task force report “*America: Still Unprepared—Still in Danger*,” co-chaired by former Senators Gary Hart and Warren Rudman. Since 9/11 he has provided congressional testimony on homeland security matters on eighteen occasions. He spent twenty years as a commissioned officer in the U.S. Coast Guard including two commands at sea, served in the White House Military Office during the George H.W. Bush administration, and was director for Global Issues on the National Security Council staff during the Clinton administration. He holds a Ph.D. and M.A.L.D. from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy and a B.S. from the U.S. Coast Guard Academy.
