

Dr. Moisés Naím, Senior Associate, Carnegie Endowment for International Peace

Dr. Moisés Naím is currently a Senior Associate with the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, International Economics Program.

Formerly, he was Editor of *Foreign Policy* magazine (appointed in 1997).

Moisés Naím has a broad background in academia, government, business, and multilateral organizations. He played a central role in launching Venezuela's economic reforms in 1989 as minister of trade and industry.

From 1990 to 1992, he was an executive director at the World Bank; he returned four years later as a senior adviser to the president to work on the development of a new global strategy for the Bank and its affiliates.

Dr. Naím is the author or editor of five books and many articles in the fields of international political economy and economic reform. He has taught at the Johns Hopkins School for Advanced and International Studies (SAIS) in Washington and at the Instituto de Estudios Superiores de Administración in Caracas, where he was dean from 1980 to 1986. From 1993 to 1996, his work as a Senior Associate of the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace centered on economic reform and on the impact of globalization.

Moisés Naím holds a Master of Science and a Ph.D. from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
